JOB SUMMARY: Under the direction of the Early Intervention Supervisor, the Early Intervention Specialist/Educator is responsible for planning and conducting effective group and individual services that train parents in techniques to enhance their child's overall development. Serves as a member of a multi-disciplinary team to provide individual and group services for children in Central Utah Public Health Department's Early Intervention program.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS-

- Instructs/leads effective group services.
- Conducts home visits with families to enhance child's development.
- Plans instructional and developmental activities for each child based on their Individualized Family Service Plan.
- Prepares materials for parent and child instruction to enhance child's development.
- Assists in development of Individualized Family Service Plan.
- Using BBI2-NU and other assessment tools when needed, conducts developmental evaluations to assist in determining program eligibility.
- Using assessment tools, conducts assessments of infants and toddlers enrolled in Central Utah Public Health Department's Early Intervention program to evaluate ongoing progress of child.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- This position requires a bachelor's degree in a related field from an accredited college or university.
- Must participate in staff and personnel development as mandated by the State of Utah. This position requires Baby Watch Early Intervention Specialist credentialing within 6 months of hire.
- Experience with children with developmental disabilities is preferred.
- Must participate in staff meetings and trainings as well as personnel development workshops.
- To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily.
- Demonstrates professionalism in all aspects of the job.
- Safeguards the confidentiality of all clients, at all times.

ADDITIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

- Must pass a criminal history background investigation.

- Must possess a valid Utah Driver License; out of state personnel are required to obtain a valid Utah Driver License within sixty days of hire date.
