JOB SUMMARY: Conducts sanitation inspections of public facilities to ensure compliance with applicable laws and regulations, particularly in the Juab and Millard County communities. Responds to and investigates complaints related to public health. Conducts public outreach, public education, and training activities related to environmental health.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Promote and protect the health and wellness of the people within the Department's jurisdiction by functioning within the framework of statutes, policies, rules, and regulations of the State of Utah pertaining to Local Health Departments.
- Inspect food establishments, temporary food establishments, mass gatherings, daycare establishments, school facilities, tanning salons, and body art establishments to ensure protection of public health and compliance with local and state public health regulations.
- Conduct plan reviews and onsite inspections to determine the suitability for onsite wastewater disposal systems by evaluating soil classifications, system designs, and system installations.
- Inspect public swimming pools and spas, collect pool water samples for lab analysis. Conduct pool water quality testing to ensure compliance with rules and regulations.
- Inspect public drinking water systems, used oil collection centers, tire recycling facilities, and other public facilities for environmental quality compliance.
- Collect drinking water samples from public and private water systems to determine compliance with drinking water standards. Provide technical support to system operators.
- Conduct inspections or investigations in response to complaints in order to ensure compliance with state and local environmental health laws, regulations, and standards.
- Teach food handler training courses to the public, as needed.
- As assigned, attend and participate in various meetings with partner agencies, the public, environmental health advisory committees, and professional associations.
- Disseminate information about public health related topics.
- Attend meetings, seminars, conferences, and training to increase technical knowledge and skills related to environmental health and other public health-related issues.
- Represent the department on various boards, work groups, coalitions, and committees as assigned.
- Prepare and submit reports, approvals, and documents related to environmental health issues.
- Respond to public health emergencies and participate in public health emergency planning as assigned by the department.
- Provide support for other department programs, and work in other public health program areas as needed and as directed.
- Be responsible for overseeing specific programs and projects within environmental health.

- o Ensure inspection forms and violation libraries are created and stay up to date with code changes and industry trends.
- o Develop and ensure environmental health program information on the department's website stays accurate and up to date.
- o Assist in training fellow environmental health staff in program changes and updates. Ensure a certain level of standardization in program inspections.
- o Work with the Environmental Health Director on proposals to develop, implement, or amend regulations, ordinances, and fees, as applicable.
- Establish procedures for new programs, including forms, violation libraries, etc., as directed by the Environmental Health Director.
- May include some level of supervision of other staff.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Applicants must be licensed as an Environmental Health Scientist with the State of Utah.
- Have at least 5 years of progressively responsible experience performing above or related duties.
- Exhibit initiative by obtaining education and/or training beyond the minimum requirements.

KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS

- Advanced knowledge of current health codes and other laws, regulations, and guidelines related to environmental health preferred.
- Skilled in reading, writing, and basic math; ability to operate various computer software programs.
- Ability to prepare accurate and complete reports.
- Ability to present information with the objective of educating other individuals in either a classroom or one-on-one setting.
- Ability to develop and maintain cooperative working relationships with those contacted during the course of work activities; respond appropriately to individuals in a professional manner; make decisions and solve problems under pressure.

ADDITIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

- Must pass a criminal history background investigation.
- Must possess a valid Utah Driver License; out of state personnel are required to obtain a valid Utah Driver License within sixty days of hire date.
